

- reside in the Bronx or Manhattan





FAMILY SERVICES COMMUNITY GRANTS

BAKER SUMMER CAMP PROGRAM

The Baker Summer Camp Program offers up to \$5000 in scholarship funds for financially disadvantaged individuals with autism to attend a summer camp, and partners with eligible camps to identify qualified campers. Camps selected to participate in the Camp Scholarship Fund are responsible for selecting scholarship campers.

In the first three years of the program, 900 camp scholarships totaling more than \$450,000 have been awarded by 150 camps in 31 states.

AUTISM CARES

AutismCares provides financial relief up to \$1,000 for individuals with autism and their families to help cover costs of critical living expenses - food, clothing, housing, automobile repair, daycare, funeral expenses, and other essential items on a case-by-case basis. Families must be affected by a natural disaster or other catastrophic life event such as the loss of job or home within the past 90 days. The grants are rewarded once per month.
